The Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission will retain an Engineering or Construction Management firm to provide construction Inspection / Project Management services for the New Central Administration Building Data Center Facility at the Turnpike Industrial Park Building, 2850 Turnpike Industrial Drive, Middletown, PA. Construction includes renovations to the Commission's Turnpike Industrial Park Building in order to house the Commission's primary Data Processing Center, Communications PBX Room, EZ Pass Operations and Traffic Operations Center. This project includes upgrading building systems, a new parking facility, communications and data systems interconnections between the new building and the Central Administration Building, site, plumbing, electrical, and Mechanical/HVAC work. Renovation to the existing Operations Center and Customer Service Center at the Central Administration Building may also be included in this project. Inspections to meet the United States Green Building Council's criteria for Leadership in Environmental and Energy Efficient Design may be incorporated into these services. The construction cost is estimated at \$32,000,000.00 and expected to be completed by December 2009. Final Design is currently being completed.

We anticipate that the selected firm will provide a staff of approximately four (4) full time on-site construction inspection personnel consisting of a resident level inspector, CDS technician and two additional inspectors. Additional inspection personnel may be required to cover multiple shifts by the contractor. All field inspection staff persons are required to have experience in building construction / trades inspection. Sufficient office personnel, managers, engineers, scheduler, technicians, and clerical staff will be required to support the field functions. The selected firm will be required to attend the prebid meetings and preconstruction conferences, write all project correspondence, and review and approve selected contractors' submissions. In addition, the selected firm will be required to keep records utilizing the Turnpike's Construction Documentation System (CDS) to document the construction progress. The selected firm will also be expected to prepare current and final estimates for payment to contractors, prepare change orders, conduct monthly job conferences, monitor monthly progress, provide liaison with affected utilities, communities and the press, conduct semifinal and final inspections, and determine the final quantities for each contract item. Coordination with affected agencies prior to and during construction may also be required. Project close-out activities, including as-built notation, and merging and purging of office and field files, will be required.

The selected firm will be required to invoice in an electronic PDF format. The firm may also be required to submit a QA plan for their services and provide a quarterly report on this function.

The Commission currently utilizes Autodesk Constructware software as a web based project management collaboration system for some of its projects. The selected firm may be required to use this system, with training and software access provided by the Commission.

Please note that the Selected Consultant, its subconsultants, and affiliated companies, cannot bid on any portion of the construction for this project.

It should be noted that the PTC may assign its field inspection personnel to this project as an addition to the Selected Firm's staff or in lieu of Construction Manager's inspection staff on a temporary or permanent basis throughout the life of this project. The Selected Firm will be required to make the field office trailer and equipment available for use by the Commission's personnel.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS AND INFORMATION

Firms interested in providing the above work and services are invited to submit a Statement of Interest with the required information. The Statements of Interest must include the following:

- One page transmittal letter clearly identifying the project reference number, brief description of the project from the advertisement, the firm's federal identification number, the firm's legal name, contact person or project manager, address of corporate office and project office. (If the firm has multiple offices, the location of the office performing the work must be identified).
- 2. A three (3)-page statement of interest on the advertised project. Each firm should demonstrate their ability to perform the specific requirements indicated for this project and provide explanation of the technical approach, stressing the Team's ability to coordinate several construction contracts that were designed by different design consultants.
- 3. An organization chart for the Project, identifying key personnel and any subconsultants and their roles. Any deviation from the subconsultant's listed in the statement of interest will require written approval from the Commission.

- 4. Tabulation or listing of workload for the prime consultant and all subconsultants for all Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission projects. Do not graphically represent the firm's workload.
- 4. A Consultant Qualification Package similar to the one submitted to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation for the current year or one that is best suited for this project. A copy of the Consultant Qualification Package printed directly from PennDOT's ECMS website is acceptable.

The Consultant Qualification Package should contain at a minimum the following information for the prime consultant and all subconsultants and attached to the back of the statement of interest (subs to follow primes):

- ECMS General Information and Project Experience Forms or Standard Form (SF) 254 – or (SF) 330 Architect-Engineer and Related Services Questionnaire in its entirety, either not more than one (1) year old as of the date of the advertisement.
- Resumes of key personnel expected to be involved in the project. (Limit to two (2) 8 1/2 x 11 pages, per person). Only resumes of key personnel should be included.
- Copy of the firm's registration to do business in the Commonwealth as provided by the Department of State for firms with out-of-state headquarters or corporations not incorporated in Pennsylvania.
- A copy of the Department's DBE/WBE Certification, if applicable.

The Turnpike Commission is committed to the inclusion of disadvantaged, minority, and woman firms in contracting opportunities. The minimum participation level for DBE/MBE/WBEs in these contracts will be 10%. Responding firms shall clearly identify DBE/MBE/WBE firms, expected to participate in these contracts, in their statement of interest. If the selected firm does not meet the minimum requirement for DBE/MBE/WBE participation, they will be required to demonstrate good faith efforts to achieve the required level. Proposed DBE firms must be certified at the time of submission Statement of Interest. If the selected firm fails to meet the established goal, it shall be required to demonstrate its good faith efforts to attain the goal.

"Certified" means a DBE certified by any of the following agencies: Allegheny County, Office of Minority, Women and Disadvantaged Business Enterprises; City of Philadelphia, Minority Business Enterprise Council; Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, Bureau of Equal Opportunity; Port Authority of Allegheny County, Office of Equal Opportunity; Southeast Pennsylvania Transportation Authority, Small & Disadvantaged Business Utilization Department or Pa Department of General Services. If a Joint Venture responds to a project advertisement, the Commission will not accept separate statements of interest from joint venture constituents. A firm will not be permitted to submit a statement of interest on more than one (1) joint venture for the same project reference number. Also, a firm that responds to a project as a prime may not be included as a designated subconsultant to another firm that responds to the same project advertisement. Multiple responses under any of the forgoing situations will cause the rejection of all responses of the firm or firms involved. This does not preclude a firm from being set forth as a designated subconsultant to more than one prime consultant responding to the project advertisement.

Firms mailing Statements of Interest should allow sufficient delivery time to ensure timely receipt of their Statement of Interest.

The statement of interest (one copy) and required information must be received by 12:00 PM (noon), Local Time, **Friday, August 1**, **2008**. Any statements of interest received after this date and time will be time-stamped and returned.

Based on an evaluation of acceptable statements of interest received in response to these solicitations, one (1) firm will be selected for this contract. The order of preference will be established for the purpose of negotiating an agreement with the highest ranked firm established by the Technical Review Committee and approved by the Commission. Technical Proposals will not be requested prior to the establishment of the final ranking.

The Commission may revise a published advertisement. If the Commission revises a published advertisement less than ten days before the Statement of Interest due date, the due date will be extended to maintain the minimum ten-day advertisement duration if the revision alters the project scope or selection criteria. Firms are responsible to monitor advertisements to assure the Statement of Interest complies with any changes in the published advertisement.

The Commission reserves the right to reject all statements of interest, to cancel the solicitation requested under this notice, and/or to re-advertise solicitation for the work and services.
