TOLL INCREASE

Motion-That the Commission approve the proposed 2023 annual toll increase of 5% across the entire Turnpike System effective January 8, 2023; E-ZPass and Toll-By-Plate (TBP) rates for passenger and commercial vehicles will round up to the nearest dime.

Chief Financial Officer Rick Dreher spoke regarding the necessity of raising tolls due to Act 44 of 2007 and the debt the Commission incurred to meet our financial obligations.

The Commission has selected firm Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc. for award based on the Commission's determination that the firm's Statement of Interest is the most advantageous to the Commission as determined by the Commission based on its review of all materials submitted, The firm has specialized experience on this type of tunnel project and proposed highly qualify staff with good relevant experience-was made by Commissioner Deon, seconded by Commissioner Logan, and passed unanimously.

 - Gannett Fleming-AWARDED

The Commission has selected firms American Engineers Group, Gannett Fleming and GEO-Mechanics for award based on the Commission's determination that all three firm's Statement of Interest are the most advantageous to the Commission as determined by the Commission based on its review of all materials submitted. All three firms demonstrated a significant range of relevant experience in providing specialized geotechnical engineering services and demonstrated the ability to serve as extensions to the Commission's staff for needs across the system. Further, both American Engineers Group and Geo-Mechanics are diverse businesses, and Gannet Fleming employs a very large number of

PA employees-was made by Commissioner Deon, seconded by Commissioner Logan, and passed unanimously.

The Firm has successfully delivered a variety of projects for the Commission in the past and currently has the lowest workload with the Commission of the Highly Recommended firms-was made by Commissioner Deon, seconded by Commissioner Logan, and passed unanimously.
