Planned Construction Activities for the Week of August 17, 2026

SECTION 53A1

JEFFERSON HILLS BOROUGH, ALLEGHENY COUNTY

Contractor: Trumbull Corporation

1. Work Shift

- The standard work shift is 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM, Monday to Thursday. Friday and Saturday shifts will be used as needed.

2. Traffic

- Coal Valley Road** – Coal Valley Road is open.
- SR 885 Clairton Road** – There will be limited construction traffic in this area.
- PTC 43/Jefferson Boulevard** – **The northbound off ramp from PA Turnpike 43 to Jefferson Boulevard is now open. Drivers must stop at the bottom of the ramp.** The temporary crossover will be removed.
- Rt 51** – Follow traffic signs, arrows, merging areas, stop and yield signs. Lane closure on northbound near Jefferson Boulevard during non-peak hours for sign installations.

3. Roadway and Bridge Work

- Bridge 400/401, 402, 403, 404/405** – Majority of work on all bridges is complete.
- Existing Northbound Ramp Bridge 342 over Brickyard Road/Rt 51** – Work is completed.
- Toll Facility** – Toll facility building interior finishes. Tolling equipment installation.

4. Noise/Dust/Runoff Control

- Stormwater basins converted to receive water run off from roadways and slowly releases water into the natural waterways.

5. Trespassing on Construction Site

- The construction being performed in this area is a Limited Access Right-of-Way owned by the Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission. The construction areas are posted with No Trespassing/Private Property signs. **No pedestrians, ATVs or motorcycles should be entering the area.**
- Violators may be prosecuted under Section 3503(b)(1)(ii) which forbids criminal trespass.
